Ticks and Lyme Disease

What Are Ticks?

Small blood-sucking spider-like creatures found in woods, fields, moorlands, parks and even gardens. They wait for and attach to passing birds, animals and people.

What is Lyme Disease?

Caused by bites from ticks that carry an infection. The infection is treatable with antibiotics if diagnosed early, but can lead to serious health issues if not recognised.

Top tips for success

Here are our top 3 tips to make the most of your fundraising activities:

Have a plan (and a budget!) – work out any costs and jobs that need to be done before you start promoting your event. If you can't manage it alone, then get someone to help you.

Maximise how many ways you can make money – think of all the different ways you can make money.

E.g. at a quiz night, you could add a raffle or charge for clues. At a sponsored walk, you offer snacks in return for donations.

Make it easy for people – make it easy for people to attend, donate, buy tickets or sponsor you. The easier it is, the more likely they are to do it.

Also don't forget to let them know about Lyme Resource Centre and why it is important to you.

Don't forget to giftaid it

In the UK, **Gift Aid** allows charities to claim an extra 25p for every £1 donated by UK taxpayers, at no cost to the donor.

If your donors are UK taxpayers, please encourage them to **Tick the Gift Aid box on your sponsor form (paper or online).**

Remember:

Gift Aid applies only to individual donations. It cannot be claimed on:

- Group collections
- If you are getting something in return (such as raffle tickets, cakes, or auction items)

By Gift Aiding your donations, you help Lyme Resource Centre make being outdoors safer without spending an extra penny!



Some guidance

We want you to have a good time organising your event, but there are some things to consider to ensure your event is safe and legal.

Raffles

To find out if you need a licence to run your raffle check out gamblingcommission.gov.uk

Insurance & licensing

As you are responsible for your event, please check if you need any special licences or insurance.

Food hygiene

If you are serving food (even just a cake sale), then food hygiene rules will apply. You can read about them here

Cash

Please ensure two people are present when counting cash, take precautions when carrying cash and store it somewhere safely before it is banked.

could pay for an outdoor sign advising people about ticks

E70 Could pay for a pop up banner with information about ticks and Lyme disease
